Golf Course Maintenance: September News

Hello all. As usual I hope everyone is enjoying the golf course. We have had some pretty good luck these last few

weeks as everything seems to be operating as planned.

We are finally getting back on track with "secondary" maintenance issues. Woods mowing is back on track, most of the material around the base of trees has been cut; tree limbs have been pruned, bunker edges are being defined and pine straw is being spread.

The height of cut on the rough continues to be a popular topic. The rough has been a little higher this year comparative to past years but for good reason. Reasons include creating a healthier stand of turf, better probability of winter performance, less scalping of turf and better definition between the fairway cut. As a plus you should notice the fairway cut has been a little wider this year to give a few extra feet before the rough starts. Soon temperatures will wane and the rough height will be more forgiving as the turf slows its growth.

The chipping green is open to all so please be sure and enjoy this new additional feature.

As always thank you for your continued support and cooperation. Please continue to repair ball marks, sand divots and use cart paths where available.

On a more serious note, I would like to discuss the pro shop inventory. As most of you know, the golfing industry is experiencing an ongoing contraction, which includes golfing equipment and supplies. Our good friends at Edwin Watts went into receivership a couple of years ago and ultimately were acquired by another golf chain, closing many stores and their main warehouse in the process. It is estimated that over 50% of all golf purchases are now made over the internet. RBCC even has to compete with local businesses that will embroider our logo on any item of clothing that you bring in, regardless of where purchased. This makes maintaining the kind of pro shop inventory that keeps everyone happy difficult at best.

Clayton, Jared and I recently sat down and explored different ways to keep the pro shop stocked without losing money on items that typically only sell when they go on sale. We jointly agreed that the pro shop needs to maintain a full line of gloves, balls, hats, visors, spikes and socks. Jared will also continue to carry a limited inventory of men's and women's shirts and accessories. Shoes and other slow moving items can be special ordered. Jared has assured me that his prices are competitive with the local golf stores and he will continue to provide a 10% discount to proprietary members. Also, if there is adequate demand for items that he does not currently carry, he will get those items into stock. So the next time you need a couple of gloves, a new hat or a dozen balls please stop in the RBCC pro shop and let us earn your business. Like the restaurant and the pool, it's hard to stay open if no one comes in.
